Great News! Our chapter has been selected for the Ohio Trails Partnership (OTP) work weekend. We will be getting help from all over the state from equestrians, mountain bikers and hikers to help us get our bridle trails back in the CVNP. The weekend is April 22 and 23. There was some last minute negotiating over the date but everything has now been finalized. All we have to do is show up and work.

Based on my latest discussions with the Park it looks like we are going to get all of our trails back including Langes Run. We will have to abandon a portion of the trail in the little valley but we will be rerouting that section to get us back over to the Wetmore trail system. We have an awful lot of work to do to get these trails into good condition so that we can ride them again. We will be meeting with the park shortly to begin the planning process. ## OHC BY-LAWS - Proposed Changes - March, 2006

The By-Laws committee is making two proposals for changes in the current by-laws. The first change would alter the current language for purposes of clarity to indicate that an individual can hold only one state elected office at a time. The reason for this change is that some have interpreted the existing language to apply to all elected OHC offices, at the county, regional and state levels while others have interpreted it to mean at the state level only. We are proposing to limit the “one elected office at a time” to the state level only. We feel that since it is a voluntary position, and the individual knows their abilities, they will not run for more offices that they can personally handle. Further it is hard enough to find suitable candidates who are willing to serve at the state level without imposing this restriction on them. Lastly, the State organization does not have a vested interest in dictating what offices members can or can not hold at the county or regional level. We decided not to comment on how many offices an individual can hold at the county level in one or more chapters. We would caution that county chapters guard against electing individuals to offices which have a conflict of interest such as president and treasurer. For example, Secretary/Treasurer combined in a small chapter should not be a conflict of interest. Holding offices in two different chapters will be admissible as long as both chapters agree.

The second revision would change the office term limits for the state officers, President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary from four (4), consecutive, one-year terms to two (2) consecutive two-year terms. The reason is to give these officers an opportunity to develop in office and have an opportunity to operate at least one year under their own budgets.

Article V: Officers / Executive Cabinet / Executive Council  
Section 1. Officers

### Current Language

- E. No member shall hold more than one (1) elected office concurrently
- F. The officers shall be elected to serve for one (1) year or until their successors are appointed or elected.                   AND
- H. No member shall be eligible to serve more than four (4) consecutive terms in the same office at the state level.

### Proposed Language Change

- E. No member shall hold more than one (1) elected state OHC office concurrently.
- F. The officers shall be elected to serve for two (2) years or until their successors are appointed or elected.
- H. No member shall be eligible to serve more than two (2) consecutive, elected, two-year terms the same office.

There are two separate issue here so we will vote on item E and then item F & H combined.

We interpret these changes to mean that the officers elected to office in November, 2006 will be eligible to serve for two consecutive 2-year terms even though they may have already served a one year term. We also interpret this two consecutive term limit to mean elected office. If an individual is appointed to an office to fill out someone else’s term, the appointed portion of the term does not apply to this limitation.

NOTE: If the change to paragraph E is not adopted, we propose to offer the following change:

- E No member shall hold more that one (1) elected OHC office concurrently,  
(state, regional or chapter)

## State OHC By-Laws Revisions

The By-Laws Committee has been working for approximately a year to update and revise our state by-laws. Last year we adopted the concept of an Executive Cabinet to assist the President in managing the organization. We formalized the concept of elected regional representative to work with the Executive Cabinet in the operation of the club. Lastly we created a Finance Committee at the state level to manage the financial affairs of the organization to insure a balanced budget.

This year we are looking to make further revisions to the by-laws but we need input in two key areas before we can entertain any significant changes. The two areas we need input on are:

### Organizational Structure

What are the roles of the Executive Cabinet, Executive Council and General Membership.

### State vs County and Regions

How should the by-laws be written to define how the State OHC organization operates but not impose unreasonable restrictions on how the county chapters and regions operate.

My personal views are that the Executive Cabinet operates like the Executive Branch of our national government. The Executive Cabinet should manage the everyday operation of the club and develop policies and practices for approval by the Executive Council and General Membership.

The Executive Council should operate like our national congress and be the governing body of the club by approving/rejecting all issues and motions offered for consideration by the Executive Cabinet or General Membership.

The Executive Council does not manage the operation of the club but is an “advise and consent” body.. The General Membership should have final approval authority for such things as. the election of state officers, dues and by-laws changes and budget approval (?). The General Membership should also have recourse to submit ideas and motions for consideration of both the Executive Cabinet and Executive Council.

As far as the relationship between the state organization and the chapters, the state by-laws should only dictate to the county chapters when it has a vested interest in doing so. The state has defined in its’ by-laws how the state organization should operate and the presumption is that the chapters must operate the same way. This is not always practical or desirable and some allowance should be made so that the chapters have the latitude to operate in a manner that suits its’ membership. Examples are whether to be member or board governed club, membership dues, timing and conduct of elections, etc.

Note: these are my views! There are many differing views even in a small group like the by-laws committee. I get to express my views because I accepted the task of writing these proposed changes. We need to develop a consensus of what the members want for our club’s organization so that we can craft by-laws to meet those expectations.
