Trail Report *by Patricia Vance*

It has been a few months since the last trail report. A lot has been done!. Back in late June and early July there were several big trees down on Riding Run. We let the park know and they were cut. The park did some repair on the erosion on the Valley trail where it is close to Akron Peninsula Road and close to the River up by the golf course. The park mowed the Valley trail and also Robinson before the Celebration. Park also mowed the trail in the area by the Hale oil well.

On July 14, our volunteers cleaned ditches and culverts and built grade dips on Perkins trail, (we used to call them swales,) to divert water off the trail. Wayne Crouse and Dan Manning repositioned the sign post and the signs at the bottom of the hill which marks the Perkins loop. The signs were pointing the wrong way! (Or are they "signages?")

The crew also included Carol Himelright, Louise Harting, Hugh Freeman, Kathy Tompkins, Bob Tompkins, Bonnie Twardowsky, Leonard Twardowsky, Kim McAninch, Mike Andrea, Shirley Sales, Russ Sales, Roy Hager, Sandy Bauer,

Linda Weese, Jack Weese Joyce Peden, Ron Bauer and Patricia Vance. A job well done. Every project on the agenda that day got done and done right!

After wards, the group had meatball sandwiches prepared by Linda Weese and Sandy Bauer and several others helping.

July 22, Patricia hiked the Langes route of the unopened trail from the back of Robinson over to Wetmore Road to check out what needed done. The park, Kim Norley and Dave Sperring, have marked all the work to be done with yellow ribbons and these are shown as the black dots on the map with the drawing of the trail route. Patricia made note of what work was best done by machine and what was best done by us. Patricia then coordinated with the park personnel. The machine work was scheduled, the excavator machine was delivered to Robinson, Doug was operating the machine. The repairs were made to the big hill behind Robinson and a ditch was made to divert water away from the tent area.

The machine was then taken to the cutoff on Wetmore Road and

Doug completed the machine work on that old lane which is now part of the reroute of Langes. Doug is a park employee and a very skilled machine operator. Dan Manning was also part of this effort.

On August 11 we had a work party and had the pleasure of being joined by 11 boy scouts and two of the Dads, Aaron Urbank and Rick Bissonette. The scouts were Nathan Urbank, Trevor Hammond, Jeff Laux, Tyler Tonsley, Jake Thursby, Nathan Lewllyn, Brad Snyder, Eric Bissonette, Jesse Timmons, Douglas Mele, and Colin Batte. (I hope I spelled the names correctly, they are off the sign up sheet.)

Club volunteers included both Medina and Summit members. Wayne Crouse, Carol Himelright, Kim McAninch, Carolyn Sullivan, Jerry Kipp, Sandy Bauer, Ansel Weese, Jack Weese, Linda Weese, Kristin Aldridge, Deb Aldridge, Pam Weese, Mike Andrea and Patricia Vance.

For this day, there were quite a few projects along the Langes trail. The group went out up the hill back of Robinson. At the first project, which was constructing a swale, several stayed and took care of it then moved on. Experienced trail hands showed how its done and these included Mike Andrea, Jerry Kipp, Carolyn Sullivan and Jack Weese. Rick and Aaron were also working right along.

The scouts learned a lot about using shovels and fire rakes. But the boys all really liked the pulaski's, which sort of resemble some of those weapons in the computer video games. Those who didn't get to carry a Pulaski from the truck were very disappointed. But they all had a chance eventually to try them out.

Everyone had a great time. The volunteers on August 11 got everything done that was to be done by us, and got it done right! Dan Manning said he wished we had a before picture of the trail on that hill, as it was repaired to perfection. No one had taken a picture before we started. Mike and I hoped that no one would ride on it so it could settle and the mud could harden up. As of this writing neither of us have been back there to check. If it has been messed up, we will have to schedule another session and that would be a shame because after we were finished with our part on August 11. All the repair that needed to be done from Robinson to Wetmore Road was completed.

The scouts camped at Robinson with us. They set up in the back field. We had a great dinner together of spaghetti and meatballs prepared by Linda Weese and company. For dessert, the scouts made dutch oven cakes and your trail committee provided chocolate ice cream.

After lunch on the 11th, the scouts had a two hour clinic toward their horsemanship badge presented by Jack Weese' fine horse Willie, and narrated by Patricia Vance and Jack Weese. The boys were very interested in finding out all the amazing things about horses. Willie was very cooperative in every way and even let them get a good look at his front teeth. Willie lost a front shoe earlier that day so the scouts could see the hoof without the shoe on one front foot and the shoe on the other hoof. They had a quiz to guess Willy's weight. Many topics were covered including feeding, grooming, health care, training, various breeds, and different horse sports. At the end, Jack showed the scouts how to

On August 5 Patricia hiked the Wetmore trail down from the trailhead counterclockwise over to Wetmore Road to check out what needed to be done and took notes. That was about 3 hours and eventually toward the end of the hike, it was raining pretty well. The notes were written up in outline form and at our quarterly meeting with the park on August 7 Mike, Jack, Patricia, Kim Norley and Dave Spearing reviewed the projects as outlined and determined which projects were machine and which were by hand. The majority were machine. Later that day, Mike and Pat went to the trail to scout out a reroute for the trail where it is on the hill after the creek crossing on the Valley Trail. Kim Norley has examined the trail and not far from the top, it is quite close to the edge of the straight drop-off and due to the erosion of the creek below, it is only a matter of time until the trail drops into the valley below. This is the reason for the reroute. Definitely a safety issue. The next day Kim was informed that the reroute had been scouted. She instructed Mike and Patricia to flag it. On Monday, August 13 Patricia was able to get away from work and flag the reroute. Kim and Dave checked it out, made one or two adjustments and approved the route. We are now waiting for the go ahead to build the trail. We expect this can be done by us by hand.

On August 18, Carol Himelright, Bonnie Bennington, Connie Shutts, Wayne Crouse, Mike Andrea and Patricia Vance took care of all the items on the list which were to be done by us. We also did some others that were not marked but we saw the need. Most of these were grade dips for drainage. Wayne took care of moving a short piece of the trail out from where it was to avoid a difficult area. All done to perfection!

On September 5, Jack Weese, Patricia Vance, Kim Norley, Dave Spering and Dan Manning, hiked the trail from Wetmore by Conway's to where the trail is close to Quick Road at Pine Hollow Parking area. The work yet to be done was defined. Additional markers were placed and by the 7th, Doug was working out there with the machine. We also arranged with the park to involve one of our volunteers, Jim Justine, who owns and operates an excavator machine to help out with the machine work and that is being done!. This trail will be open soon!

The three of us get reports from folks about trees down. We let the park know. If you see any problems on the trail, just contact Mike Andrea, Jack Weese or Patricia Vance.

Next session is September 15. We want to invite all of you to come out to the trail sessions. We have a great time and it is gratifying to see how much we all can accomplish in a short time to keep our trails in shape. And, thank you to all of you who have joined us on these projects!
