Trail Report ~ May 2008

The Horse Trail Wilderness Adventure on April 19 was a great success! We had a good showing of adventurers. We cleared and created two reroutes. The major project was the Valley trail from the railroad tracks west to the covered bridge. Due to the disappearance of the trail into the creek, the trail had to be relocated. We cleared from just west of the tracks through the woods to the north to connect to the tractor lane on the edge of the cornfield next to Everett Road. The tractor lane goes to the parking area and from there to the covered bridge.

We took out woody plants, multiflora, and other vegetation in the trail route. We removed stumps and filled holes. Dan Manning of the park operated the pole saw and cut branches and dead trees and we removed the branches and trees off the trail. We also obliterated and covered up the old trail. Wayne Crouse and Bob Tompkins were installing signposts. Our youngest adventurer, Madison Fleming, age 9, was taking branches from the trail and doing a fine job of it.

When that trail was done, we headed over to the connector road to clear and create another trail. Again, the reason for the reroute – the same creek, Furnace Run is its name, has taken a piece of the trail with it. This project was not as big as the other, it is a shorter route. The group cleared branches, trees, stumps, holes, created a swale or two and also covered up the old trail.

The other adventurers on the 19th were Bonnie Bennington, Jack Weese, Carol Himelright, Linda Weese, Kim McAninch, her son, Perry McAninch, a handsome 16 year old lad, Rosemary Young, Kathy Tompkins, Sandy Bauer, Mike Andrea and Patricia Vance.

There are still some final things needed to complete these two projects. The area where the corn field is belongs to Akron Summit County metroparks. They want all of the old trail made to look as if no trail had been there. Your committee is working on an idea to get this done efficiently using some type of implement which would use horse power.

Congratulations to all of you who took part in the Wilderness Adventure! Everyone there was treated to a delicious breakfast prepared by Kathy and Bob Tompkins. Thank you Kathy and Bob!

Your committee has recently met with the park staff. There are many projects for us this season. The Wetmore reroute is in need of re-



pair. Folks were riding on it before it had a good chance to harden and so is full of hoof holes in places. We will be making these repairs on May 17. There are several other repairs needed in that area of the Wetmore trail. The park has

done some preliminary analysis of the unopened part of the Wetmore loop. There are many, many things needed to be done to get this in shape to open. This remains closed. The park has also done some preliminary analysis of Dickerson trail, also still closed. Your committee has been given the assignment to assess the work, and determine how the work will be done and whether by our volunteers or by the park. The nature of the repair is the main criteria on this. You may look back at your trail articles from last August through November for some idea of what this entails.

The park is again this year granting our club the privilege of using Robinson field as a staging area for our trail maintenance session and allowing us to camp there on those sessions. Your committee would like to remind all of you who enjoy riding our trails, that our volunteer hours are vitally important to the park. Due to the cutback in funds allocated to the park, volunteer help is needed more than ever. So, if you enjoy the privileges granted to our club, make it a point to show up and help out - every time!

Remember, if you want to get a call to help out on some projects on days other than the official monthly session, please give your contact information to one of the trail committee, Mike Andrea, Jack Weese or Patricia Vance.

See all of you and many more of you on May 17! Meet at Wetmore Trail head at 8:30 or when you can get there. We are usually done by noon or 1pm. This is the most important function of our club.

Here's some information that you may not know.

Printing and mailing out each newsletter costs about \$1.57 a month per person. That's \$18.84 a year for each member who needs a printed copy. Postal rates are due to increase and that will push the cost up higher. We are currently able to just about break even due to those folks who access the newsletter via the website. So you can see why this increase is needed. Costs for printing and mailing various other information is part of this as well.

DIRECTIONS: From I-271 take 303 East to first light (Peninsula), turn right on Riverview, 5 miles to Ride Headquarters in Howe Meadow. **OR: Use exit 143 on I-77** (exit is located 23 miles south of Cleveland, 13 miles north of Akron, at I-271 intersection), turn left, go east on Wheatley/ Everett Road (changes names before turnoff) 2 miles to town of Everett (road ends), turn right (south) on Riverview. Howe Meadow is approximately 1 1/2 miles on the right. **There is a special entrance for BIG RIGS at the FIRST ENTRANCE located to the right of the site. Do not try to go up little hill and over tracks...You will get stuck!**

CAMPING: Semi primitive, port-a-potties. Electric is available for a fee. Horse & Human Water is provided.

Stores, motels, restaurants located within 6 miles of the site. Grounds officially open on Friday at 11:00am.
