DIRECTIONS: From northbound I-271, take Richfield exit, turn right on Brecksville Rd, turn left at light on Wheatley cross I-77 and follow Wheatley to Riverview; From southbound I-271 take 303 East to first light (Peninsula), turn right on Riverview, 5 miles to Ride Headquarters in Howe Meadow. **OR:** from I-77 Use exit 143 (exit is located 23 miles south of Cleveland, 13 miles north of Akron, at I-271 intersection), turn left, go east on Wheatley 2 miles to town of Everett (road ends), turn right (south) on Riverview. Howe Meadow is approximately 1 1/2 miles on the right. **There is a special entrance for BIG RIGS at the FIRST ENTRANCE located north end of the site. Do not try to go up little hill and over tracks...You will get stuck! REMINDER: THESE ARE ACTIVE TRAIN TRACKS!**

The Big Rig entrance will NOT be open on Saturday from 7am to 1pm, so plan your arrival accordingly!

CAMPING: Semi primitive, pit toilets. Electric is available for a fee. Horse & Human Water is provided.

Stores, motels, restaurants located within 6 miles of the site. Grounds officially open on Friday at 11:00am.

By special arrangement only, grounds will open earlier if needed.

TERRAIN: Mostly woods, improved bridle trails with a few steep climbs.

TRAIL REPORT ~ May 2010 by Patricia Vance

April 17, our volunteers removed leaves from Perkins Trail. The entire trail is now completely cleared of leaves. Ditches and culverts are cleaned. Out there on April 17 were Jack Weese, Bonnie Bennington, Cheryl Hess, Mike Andrea and *Reina*, and Patricia. We accessed the trail from behind Hale Farm via the access lane to the oil well. The Park provided leaf blowers and the Gator. So the Gator carried the tools and fuel up the hill. Mother Nature did not send the rain until all of us were done.

Our trails now are in remarkably good shape thanks to all who have stepped up to help remove leaves. Without the leaves, the surface of the trail can dry. We do need to give some attention to the ditches on Riding Run.

Overall the trails are in incredibly good shape thank to all the other work done by all of our volunteers in cooperation with our friends at the Park.

Your committee will be attending our quarterly meeting with the Park May 11. We will be discussing the projects to be worked on this season. We will be discussing the situation regarding opening Dickerson trail. Your committee has made a list of projects which should be done by machine and projects for our people. Your committee has been doing a super job determining what needs done and organizing the work parties so that no volunteer has to stand around and wonder. And, we always have a lot of fun!

Your committee continues to keep the Park informed of any immediate issues that need attention, such as fallen trees blocking trails.

We are continuing with our own form of Adopt A Trail, which we refer to as Ride, Repair and Report. The current adopters are Stacy Sadar, Jack Weese, Mike Andrea, Roxanne and Larry Owens, Carolyn Sullivan and Patricia Vance. There are several segments of the trail still open. Let me know. In the meantime, your committee is checking on the orphans. Our club adopted the horse trails long before there was any official program.

Reminder: if you see anything on the trail that needs attention, do not call the park, call one of us – Mike, Jack or Patricia.

The Trail Plan is continuing to move ahead. Our club is what they refer to as a Stakeholder. We submitted our response to the survey and we attended the public meetings. We have now been invited to take part in the field visits. Your committee has accepted the invitation.

The Park recognizes our club as one of the five primary volunteer groups. The others are Cuyahoga Valley Trails Council, Adopt-A-Trail, Trail Blazers and Buckeye Trail Council. These five groups, in 2009, collectively provided 10,000 volunteer hours towards the trails.

As a result of the scoping survey and the public meetings almost 500 ideas were generated. These ideas encompass visitor experience, trail conditions and trail management and support. Goals for the Plan have been drafted. They are: 1. Provide a trail network that creates a high quality visitor experience for a variety of trail users. 2. Provide trail experiences that share the historic, scenic, natural and recreational significance of the park while maintaining their preservation. 3. Provide a trail network within the park that minimizes impact to the park's historic, scenic, natural and recreational resources. 4. Provide a trail network that can be sustained. 5. Encourage cooperative partnerships with volunteer organizations, adjacent landowners, local communities, and other governmental agencies.

These goals will be the basis to guide the planning process and evaluate alternatives of the trail plan and environmental impact statement. NPS will continue to work with its Interdisciplinary Team to develop objectives under each goal.

As a Stakeholder, we will be asked for our thoughts on initial concept alternatives for the trails in the park. Many of you have provided your thoughts for the trail plan to your trail committee and these have been incorporated in our response to the survey. If you have any other thoughts on initial concept alternatives for the trails, let one of us know.
