Good Morning! It has been a very busy time for our members. Many of us have devoted countless hours to the Trail Plan. In conjunction with Cuyahoga and Summit Chapters we have submitted Response to the Draft Alternatives. We believe our response sets out the position of the equestrian trail users. Our response includes four proposed new trails. (Full information in this month's Trail Report.

October was the month for our Halloween Gala and clambake and the Obstacle Ride both were very successful. Thanks to Jack, Ruess, Linda and all who helped out.

Our trail maintenance projects are producing great improvements and the Park has been able to get to some of the major projects which have been needed for some time. Please see this month's Trail Report for details.

Your Trail committee minus Patricia, met with the Park for our quarterly meeting on November 1. The accomplishments of projects finished were reviewed and work for the November 20 session was discussed. Bill Zimmer has canceled the "Ride and Report" trail survey which had been implemented for equestrian trails as a form of "Adopt A Trail". He wants to have something much more specific and formal. Volunteers for this will need to have training as it will involve detailed specific reporting of trail conditions including photographs and gps locations. This will come to pass sometime around April 2011. We will keep you informed.

We will have a meeting on December 1, at Boston Store. As in past years, this affords a chance to plan what events we will have in 2011 and vote on allocating funds for each event decided on as well as dates for the events. We may again decide there will be no need for meetings in January or February as all these matters will be determined in December. In past years, due to snowstorms January or February

## TRAIL REPORT ~ October 2010 *by Patricia Vance*

October 16 we had 15 volunteers show up who accomplished an amazing lot of trail maintenance! as usual. The main project was removing leaves. Norm Rieker of the Park, brought out the necessary tools, including leaf blowers, rakes and the Ventrac. (leaf blower mounted on a small tractor)

Jack Weese took the Ventrac and did Langes starting from back of Robinson. After that did Butler and Langes from Wetmore to junction of Wetmore trail.

Stacy Sadar and Jim Justine started on Wetmore loop from trailhead and went left on the loop. Becky Sheryak and Cynthia Greene went right on the loop. Phil and Ronda Urbank and Sheila Rizer started at the area of Wetmore where it is close to Quick Road across from Little Meadow parking area. They chose to use leaf rakes and cleared from their start area all the way to the other side of the upper pasture before the woods.

Hanna Stein, Chris Stein, Austin Thompson (the Midnight Riders) took leaf blowers and along with Mike Andrea, Greg Monsanty and Patricia started where Wetmore loop is near the Pine Hollow lot on Quick Road. Mike, Hannah, Chris and Austin proceeded counterclockwise on Wetmore (west) until they reached area where trail was cleared, (Stacy and Jim had run out of fuel, returned to trailhead to get fuel and then clear Valley from Wetmore trailhead back to Robinson). Mike, Hannah, Chris and Austin then turned back, met up with Greg and Patricia at the double creek crossing and all proceeded to clear from there going clockwise. Very soon, Greg had to leave this group and go to the rescue of Becky and Cynthia who were out of fuel.

Earlier, Mike, Greg and Patricia went with Norm to have a look at the work started by the Park at the problem area of that crossing. The Park had begun machine work and set several large stones. A day or so earlier, Norm had contacted Patricia of your trail committee to meet him at the site to give input from the horse perspective. As it happens, Greg Monsanty has a good bit of experience in this line of work. He made some suggestions as to what should be done. Problem solved! Park went ahead then and the hideous crossing is now absolutely a thing of beauty! This is yet another example of the great cooperation between our club and the Park. Many of our volunteers have expertise in certain areas and are willing to help out in any way they can. Another example is Mike Andrea, who has expertise in building bridges and has volunteered on many bridge projects.

By the time the "Midnight Riders" had returned to the area near Quick Road across from Pine Hollow lot, they looked like they needed a break. Patricia ordered them to shut the machines off and chill for awhile. Most of us started out the day with coats, but after a couple of hours it was too warm. So Patricia took the coats to the car at parking lot and returned with some apples which were enjoyed by the "Midnight Riders." After that all continued all the way to where the trail comes close to Quick Road across from Little Meadow lot. Mike, Ronda, Phil and Wayne were there, having finished their projects for the day. Wayne repaired some swales on Wetmore on the other side.

A job well done by all! Everyone returned to Robinson for a fine lunch prepared by head chef, Karen Knuth and her crew.

On October 30 the Park took the Ventrac over to Riding Run and Jack Weese cleared leaves off the old Meier Road section of the trail. Molly Eastwood cleared culverts and Patricia Vance cleared leaves.

Most of the leaves are down now. Recall last year Mother Nature provided nice dry reasonably warm weather in November and so far, it looks like that for this year. We are able to see the results of removing the leaves as early as we can – the trail get a chance to dry and harden up.

Your committee will be contacting you to set up some more leaf sessions. The job is easier nowadays as we are able to use the Park's powerful backpack leaf blowers. The ventrac is great but is only good for flat areas. If you want to be sure to be included let one of us know, Jack, Mike or Patricia.

November 20 is our annual joint session with the Trails Council. As you know, the core group of Trails Council volunteers are really

hard workers. One project will be the Perkins switchback which has been a project for the last two years. There also will be leaves and ditches yet to do. Bill Zimmer has proposed a project in the Pinery Narrows area for that day, spreading some material on the horse trail. Your committee will be meeting out there with Bill this week to check this out.

November 20 we will be meeting at the Covered Bridge lot at 9 a.m. instead of 8:30. As always all volunteers will be treated to a great lunch.

We have been very involved in our response to the Draft Alternatives presented by the Trail Planner in September. The deadline for responses was October 30. Our October 6 monthly meeting drew a large crowd. The main topic was our response to the Alternatives. Everyone had a chance to comment. Members from all three Stakeholders were present. Equestrian Stakeholders selected by the Park to represent the equestrian users are Medina, Summit and Cuyahoga County OHC chapters.

At the October 6 meeting it was decided to form a Trail Plan Analysis Committee. The TPAC met on Tuesday evening October 12 at Savacol House. Committee members: Maureen Mizerak, Reuss Griffith, Becky Kibler, Linda Weese, Ron Bauer, Molly Eastwood, Jack Weese, Becky Sheryak, Mike Andrea and Patricia Vance.

Maureen Mizerak brought to the meeting a draft she prepared listing each of the 6 questions and some comments to each based on comments made at the October 6 meeting. This was tremendously helpful in facilitating the process. Each member of TPAC present gave input based on what had been given at the October 6 meeting and all other comments received from equestrians. We finalized responses to each of the 6 questions and discussed locations for proposed trails. We were to study the drafts and think about where to propose trails. We met again Tuesday October 19. We finalized the text of the responses to each question, and trail locations were proposed and discussed. Three trails were proposed. Molly Eastwood and Jack Weese proposed a fourth, a loop added to Riding Run following Wheatley Road on the south side.. Discussion was had as to the effect of proposing a shorter trail as we disapprove of the Plan's Alternatives for several very short horse trails. Would this take away from our major proposal? Eventually this was resolved. It was suggested by Becky Sheryak and Patricia Vance, that this could afford connection to proposed equestrian trails extending out of the Park. So it was decided to include in our response the fact that there is an existing connecting equestrian trail (Everett Trail) built by Summit Chapter which is currently in use by equestrians, starts at Riding Run Trail next to Everett Road and goes west.

Becky Sheryak, Summit member, was able to have the park map in color enlarged and printed so we could better mark on the map where our proposed trails would be. After we marked the map, Becky arranged to have it again transferred back to digital media. Our response contains written descriptions of each proposed trail. The response was required to be sent electronically on a special NPS web site, so we could not include the map. Our response references that hard copy of the map and response would be delivered. Patricia did this and it was received by Lynn Garrity.

Many thanks to all our volunteers who have devoted time and talent to this effort.

The Response and the Map are posted on the websites of Medina, Summit and Cuyahoga County Chapters. Any questions let your president or trail committees know.

Trail Planner, Lynn Garrity joined us at our meeting November 3. She provided some background on her professional qualifications for the job. She explained how each of the alternatives was arrived at. She explained the four Federal statutes the Park is required to follow.

The original scoping survey that we all responded to was a major factor. She answered all questions asked. It was a very productive hour. Those folks who have had the feeling that we are being ignored and felt this must be an adversarial situation, had a chance to get a bit acquainted with Lynn and get a better idea of what is trying to be accomplished. We all came away with the feeling that our input is welcome and being considered. Thanks very much to Lynn for speaking with us.

We now know that we will have another opportunity to give input to what will be the final draft with the proposed trails identified conceptually rather than precisely. As you all know, the trails we have proposed are also identified conceptually as it is not possible at this time to define the exact route until more is known about the terrain and other aspects which must be considered.

Keep in mind everyone, we OHC members are positive, responsible people. The Park selected our three chapters as Stakeholders representing the equestrian users. OHC members in our three chapters enjoy an excellent reputation. We are seen by Park personnel as positive, responsible, helpful people who are always willing to volunteer to help and to resolve any issues.



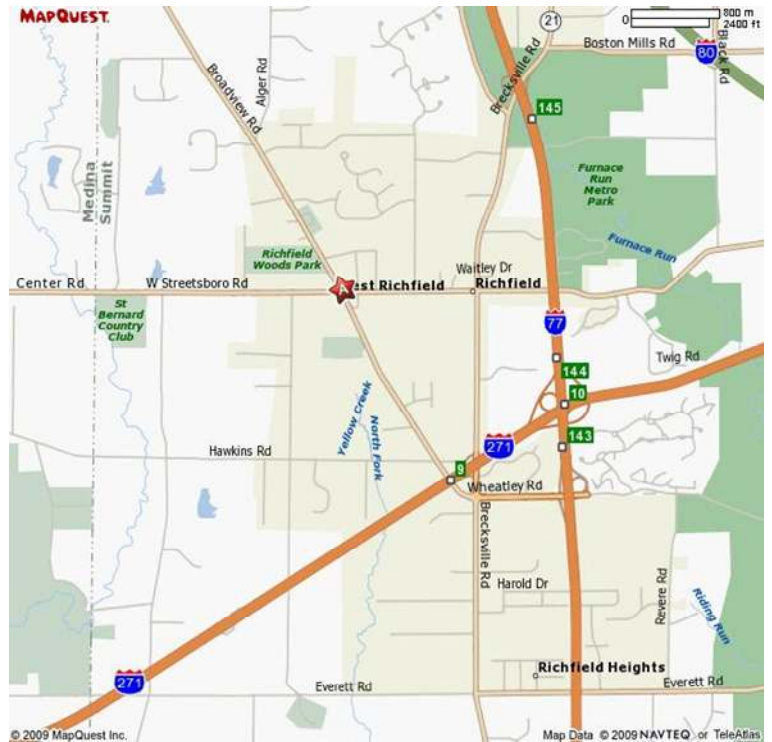
