The 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary committee, Rosemary Young, Cynthia Greene and Stacy Sadar reported on their progress with anniversary party. A word for the horse. We are all getting eager to get out on the trails. Winter has been fierce and most of our horses have been off for the winter, doing what they do best, eating and producing manure.

We should remember that the horse is made of bones, muscles, ligaments, heart, digestive organs, blood vessels etc just like us. If we have been "sitting on the couch" this winter, we may not be able to jog

around the Wetmore loop in an hour and a half! Keep this in mind with your horse. Even if you “only go trail riding” as folks say, your horse needs conditioning. Start your conditioning slowly. Write out a plan, start out slow, gradually increase the distance and pace. See how your horse is coming along, pay attention to your horse, the horse will let you know. Just because they are big does not mean they don't get sore muscles just like us.

I recommend to you a very inexpensive booklet published by the Arabian Horse Association entitled *To Finish is to Win*, which is a manual for the beginning distance rider. This little book is full of great information. (It is available at your club store.) I refer to it from time to time. Trail riding is a form of distance riding without competing. And remember, from all those seminars you observe at the Equine Affaire, (John Lyons, Stacy Westfall, etc) horses are not humans, we need to think like the horse thinks.

This memoir was one included in our Heritage Banquet Memoir Book in 2008.*

## ***As I remember ~~~ by Sandra Bauer Charter Member***

George Windate sat down with the park and got approval to proceed to develop horse trails in the CVNP (formerly known as the Cuyahoga Valley Recreation Area). He sent out flyers saying what the plans were and said he wanted to get an Ohio Horseman's Council started to promote and build horse trails in the CVNP.

At the first meeting, in Sharon Center, there were over 100 people who showed up and said they were interested in doing this. As nice weather came about we started our first mile of trail. We saddled the horses, tied our hand tools, buckets, saws, shovels, and packed lunch onto the horses and rode out to begin our trail building adventure.

Our staging area at that time was the house and barn next to what is now the Wetmore Trail Head. We parked in the big pasture area in front of the house and behind the barn.

We went down the hill back of the house and barn and made a sharp right and went along the lower level and built two bridges. Those were the first two bridges we built. It took quite a while to get that first mile of trail built.

While we worked, we picketed the horses in cross ties so that they wouldn't damage the trees. At lunchtime we'd sit down and hash out plans for the future and admire our accomplishments. Then we'd pick up and start to work again.

Eventually we'd end up back at our staging area at the house and barn. We'd have a campfire and make Garbage Can Stew. The club would provide the meat and all of the workers would bring canned vegetables to mix in with the meat. We'd bring desserts to share and have a good meal and a lot of fun.

At some point in time, we got the right to stay overnight. We were energetic and enthusiastic and wanted to work an additional day. We were all very excited about the growth and future of the Wetmore Trail System. It took us quite a few years to get 4 miles of trails built, but we did it.

There were so many that I remember from the very start: George Windate, Hugh Freeman ("The Enforcer"), Gene Shamblin, Virgil White, Mary and Whitey, Barb Harding, Joe Bush, Barb Cathcart Vega, Carol Double, Pat Oxley Hill, Ron Bauer, Sandy Shaw Bauer and Sons, Chuck Reed, Tom and Char Tarkey, Dick Baus, Al Garratt, Larry and Cindy Novick, Phil Urbank and many others whose names I can't think of right now.

Al Garratt, besides doing a lot of carpentry work for us, also used to bring his brush hog down to Robinson Field and get it ready for our work parties. Phil Urbank walked the trails and did needed trail work on his own time, and was always there with his brush hog when needed. He also got the water well going at Robinson Field and at the old house and barn before that. Phil donated his time and materials for the wells and much more.

Then a little bit later, we converted Ronda Heidinger from the Show World to the Trail World and eventually married her off to Phil Urbank. So see, budding romance does occur on our bridle trails or should I say "bridal" trails. There's hope for all the single men and women out there, you'll never know where you'll find that special someone.

The next exciting memory was the floods of July 2003 and May 2004 that devastated the Valley. This brought about the birth of the Valley Girls Calendar and the eight courageous ladies that "bared their backs" to raise money to rebuild trails severely damaged by torrential amounts of rain. This project brought in a profit well over \$20,000 towards rebuilding our damaged trails. A very special thank you to the Valley Girls: Sherry, Hope, Louise, Rosemary, Ronda, Carol, Deb and of course me Sandy. We wouldn't have been as brave if our fearless leader Sherry had hadn't made that trip to Woodstock all those years ago! I can't top that. So that's the end of my memories for now. We're still making more memories and hope to for many years to come.

**Editor's Update – In 2009, the remaining Valley Girl Calendar proceeds of \$17,500 was donated to the CVNPA Trails Forever Program to be used only for bridle trail projects in the CVNP.**

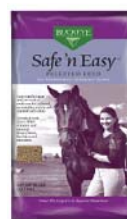
