My son Ansel who works at Carter Lumber in Kent tells me that he has requested the folks next door to Carter that they give the electric poles that were used to construct the pole building next door which will be demolished before too long to MOHC. If we are able to get these poles we will have more than enough poles to repair the high lines in Robinson Field.

Some of you may remember that a few years ago longtime MOHC member Rob Pliskin gave a natural horsemanship presentation at one of our club meetings. This year Rob will be doing a more extensive series of natural horsemanship topics. He will speak at our April club meeting and then when the weather warms up and Robinson Field dries out he will do some hands on workshops after some of the work sessions. I believe all of us will benefit from his words of wisdom. I'm looking forward to hearing what the Rob has to say.

Becky Sheryak (President of Summit OHC) and I are working on a March program starring Hank Keys sharing his knowledge of Cowboy Mounted Shooting. I will pass along the details as soon as we get everything planned.

Going on to some personal notes. My little walking horse Willie tells me that he enjoyed the New Year's Day ride. He has learned that when he is leading a ride that he is supposed to go at least what for him is very slow. Kim was so happy that everything went well and that she will be back riding in about five weeks.

Linda and I will be going to the State Planning Retreat at Mohican State Lodge later in the month. I'll be there as Chairman of the State By-Laws Committee and State Trail Rides Committee and as a member of the Equine Affaire Committee and the All American Youth Horse Show working the gates committee. On Sunday afternoon I will be at the Chapter Presidents meeting. While Linda is not the Equine Affaire Booth Committee Chairman this year she is still very much involved with the event. It will be a busy weekend, but a lot of fun and it will be nice to see our many friends from all over the state.

January 2012 TRAIL REPORT

HAPPY NEW YEAR from your trail committee!

The three of us continue as your trail committee in 2012, Mike Andrea, Jack Weese and me, Patricia.

If it wasn't for all the rain, we might have set up some special maintenance sessions in December it has been relatively warm and mainly no snow. Our equine friends let us know a couple of months ago, this will be a wet winter – coats really thick.

We notice most folks are keeping off our trails and this is good. I have hiked most of them recently and they are extremely waterlogged for the most part and slick on the hills. As we know, horses dig deep into the mud and our clay soil holds the water. Areas that were small muddy areas are now huge wet areas.

Our first trail session is set for March 17 and if the weather that day proves undesirable, then the following Saturday, March 24. Those dates coincide with the Hale Farm Maple Syrup Festival. Unique News, Views, and Little-Known Facts About Your Acre **Winter Solstice-December 21, 2011**

Dear Patricia A. Vance / Medina County OHC ~ Sponsor of Acre 3538,

The winter solstice 2011 not only brings the beginning of the winter season, but also brings to a close the wettest calendar year in the recorded history of our area. Normal annual precipitation is just over 3 feet and we are currently at over 5 feet. A large residential swimming pool holds about 30,000 gallons of water and the 2011 precipitation on each of our acres would have filled 57 of those pools. That's 228 truckloads of pool water for every acre in the park. It is easy to understand the importance of how much of that water is retained by each acre and how much runs off to impact everything and everyone downstream. We tend to enjoy our park as a place of recreation, but it's role in controlling runoff amount and quality is often overlooked. Imagine that our ParkShares acres were covered with blacktop. That would generate over 850,000 swimming pools or over 3.4 million truckloads of water of dubious quality looking for a place to flood.

It's true that the runoff from the Park is drained by the Cuyahoga River, so it's sort of "water under the bridge"; but most of us are drinking from the end of the drain. Phosphates from natural and artificial sources are conveyed to Lake Erie by runoff and phosphates fertilize the growth of algae. Park acres tend to mitigate the amount of runoff and decrease contaminants within it. We won't try to quantify the effect in this letter, but thank goodness academics and other experts are doing just that. We have researched their work to determine the contribution of your specific type of acre. Please pardon the lack of footnotes in this non-academic letter. If you are interested in further investigation we'll be happy to provide our sources.

Although your farmland acre has been shown by some studies to retain only about one fourth as much water as a forest acre, the same studies indicate that a farmland acre retains twice as much as an acre developed for housing. It's also important to note that the type of farming within our park probably maximizes the quality of water that does run off.

You chose an acre not directly associated with a ParkShares landmark which might indicate that you have a personal connection to your acre. One of your fellow sponsors related a connection with his acre in a video that you might like to view at http://youtube.com/watch?v=JF4oxxLLr6A&feature=youtube_gdata_player.

Supporting the park through ParkShares is a good thing in many ways. Sponsoring to capture a personal memory is great in itself, and your sponsorship also helps to preserve an area that benefits us in ways that are not obvious. During this wettest year you have indirectly helped create more drinks of clean water and fewer buckets of dirty flood water. Tell your friends about the program or give someone special an acre by visiting www.ParkShares.org. The acres are not only fun, but each one is vitally beneficial as well.
